About Vision To Learn

Vision To Learn is a non-profit organization that provides free eye exams and free glasses to students in low-income communities to give them every chance to succeed in school and in life. The program was founded in Los Angeles in 2012 and has since expanded to schools throughout areas of California, Delaware, Georgia, Hawaii, Iowa, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, New Jersey, Virginia, and now North Carolina. In Spring 2018, Vision To Learn anticipates it will bring its program to the first school in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg School (CMS) District, and beginning in September 2018, across CMS schools. Vision To Learn examined over 300,000 students and provided over 250,000 children with free glasses. Vision To Learn partners with school districts to provide eye exams to children in low-income communities with unmet needs for glasses. Our mobile eye clinics arrive at the school on a pre-scheduled date. We see an average of 25 students daily on our mobile clinic.

Position Description Vision to Learn is seeking a qualified candidate for a **North Carolina Licensed Optician. This position will be full-time beginning in February 2021.**

Key position responsibilities:

- Oversee operation of a mobile eye clinic. Maintain the highest possible professional standards in driving performance, and customer service to the patients while on board the vehicle. Responsible for safe transportation of the vehicle to predetermined site visits and return to secure parking facility
- Set up the clinic, monitor inventory, and ensure that all patient and administrative paperwork facilitates an efficient workflow
- Conduct pre-testing for eye examinations and maintain the highest possible professional standard
- Measure, fit and adapt frames for patients according to written optical prescriptions. Assist patients with selecting frames and measure patients for size of eyeglasses. Coordinate frames with facial and eye measurements and optical prescription
- Dispense glasses to patients
- Prepare daily reports
- Follow-up calls with patient and/or patient families for feedbacks
- Load, secure, inspect and fuel vehicle before and as necessary during the course of the shift
- Keep vehicle and internal work area within vehicle organized and clean for safety and efficiency
- Conduct vision screenings

- Ability to lift up to 20 pounds and to exert well-paced mobility for an 8-hour shift including standing, walking, bending and squatting

Qualifications

- Optician Diploma, North Carolina Optician License, ABO certification.
- Valid driver license required, with good driving record and familiarity with greater Charlotte, NC geography; driving transcript and working personal vehicle must be provided
- Successful track record of working with children and school administrators
- Excellent organizational and prioritization skills
- Strong interpersonal and written communication skills
- Must pass Department of Justice background check (LiveScan) and drug test
- Experienced using Microsoft Office – outlook, excel, word; EMR systems experience a plus.
- Spanish or other language skills a plus
